1. About the UITP Summit

It welcomes over 10,000 public transport professionals ranging from operators, authorities, industry suppliers and policy makers from across the world.

3. What is an Expo Session?

The Expo Sessions ensure interaction between the Congress and the Exhibition components of the UITP Summit 2025. These sessions are integrated into the Summit program and are presented by exhibitors in dedicated locations within the exhibition halls.

The Expo Sessions provide exhibitors with a platform to showcase their innovations offering Summit's attendees the opportunity to learn more about the latest technological advancements and business development opportunities.

4. Rules for Submissions

The selection of the submitted papers and the definition of the Expo Sessions programme is carried out by the Expo Sessions Selection Committee composed by UITP experts and is based on the papers submitted through the call for Expo Sessions.

An Expo Session lasts 60 minutes and includes 4 speeches of 10-12 minutes, plus a Q&A and discussion time of approximately 15 minutes.

1. This call is **exclusively reserved for exhibitors** of the UITP Summit – Hamburg 2025 and only presentations referring to products, technologies and equipment presented in Hamburg will be selected. The number of presentations per organisation will be limited.
2. Applicants are requested to submit their applications online via [the dedicated platform](#). Applications made through other channels will not be evaluated.
3. In addition to a detailed description of their presentation, applicants will be asked to write a short biography and to upload a portrait photograph (ID card format). All information is to be provided **in English only**.
4. Applications will be selected based on the presentation description, with a focus on quantifiable results and/or effects, the quality and significance, relevance and value to the audience as well as the experience of candidates.
5. A selected speaker is not allowed to designate a substitute in case he/she is not available. It is up to the Selection Committee to make such a decision if relevant.



6. UITP does not cover travel, accommodation, or any other costs for speakers. However, speakers benefit from a special rate policy for attending the Summit sessions: they receive complimentary registration for the day of their presentation. If speakers wish to attend additional days of the Summit, the **Exchange special rate** will apply.
7. In order to ensure variety in the final selection, UITP particularly encourages profile diversity as well as geographical and gender balance.
8. UITP has the exclusive copyright of all selected applications.
9. Speakers must be aware that the Expo Sessions Selection Committee reserves the right to cancel their participation if they do not comply with the speakers' guidelines which they will receive once they are selected.

5. Timeline

- The Call for Expo Sessions **opens on 26 September 2024** and **closes on 31 January 2025 – 23:00 CEST**.
- Confirmation and announcements will be made to successful candidates after the review by the Selection Committee.
